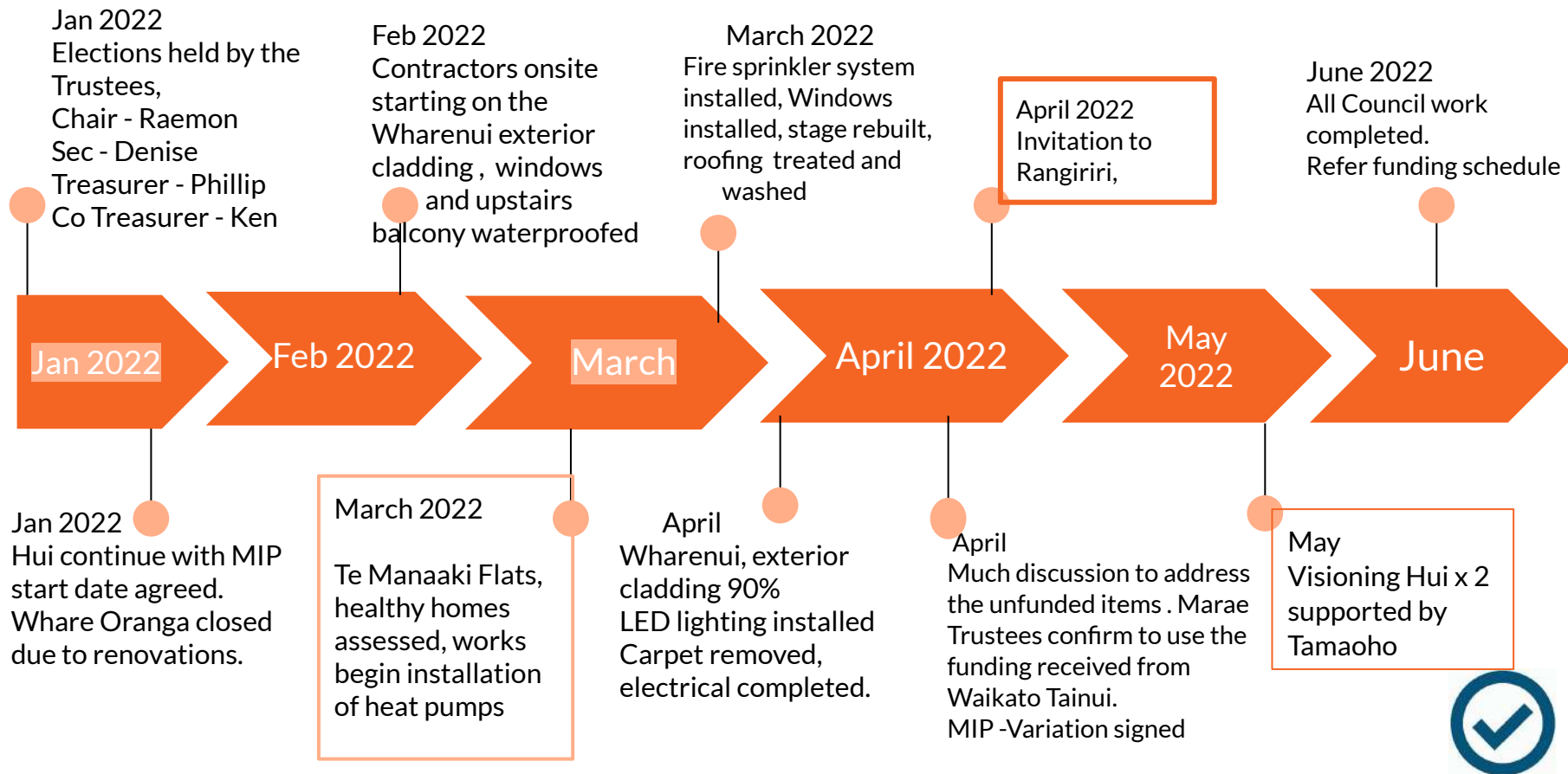

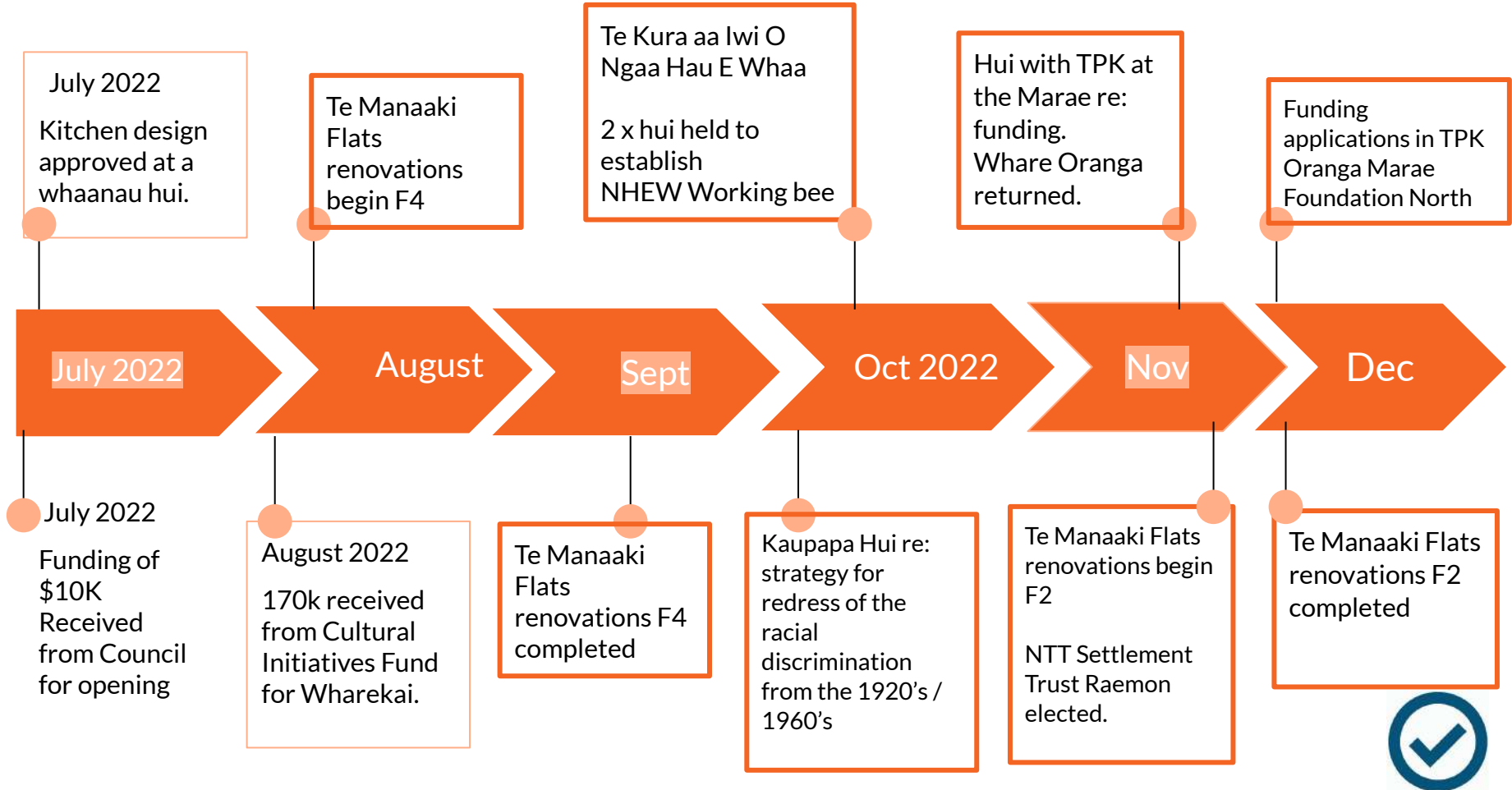

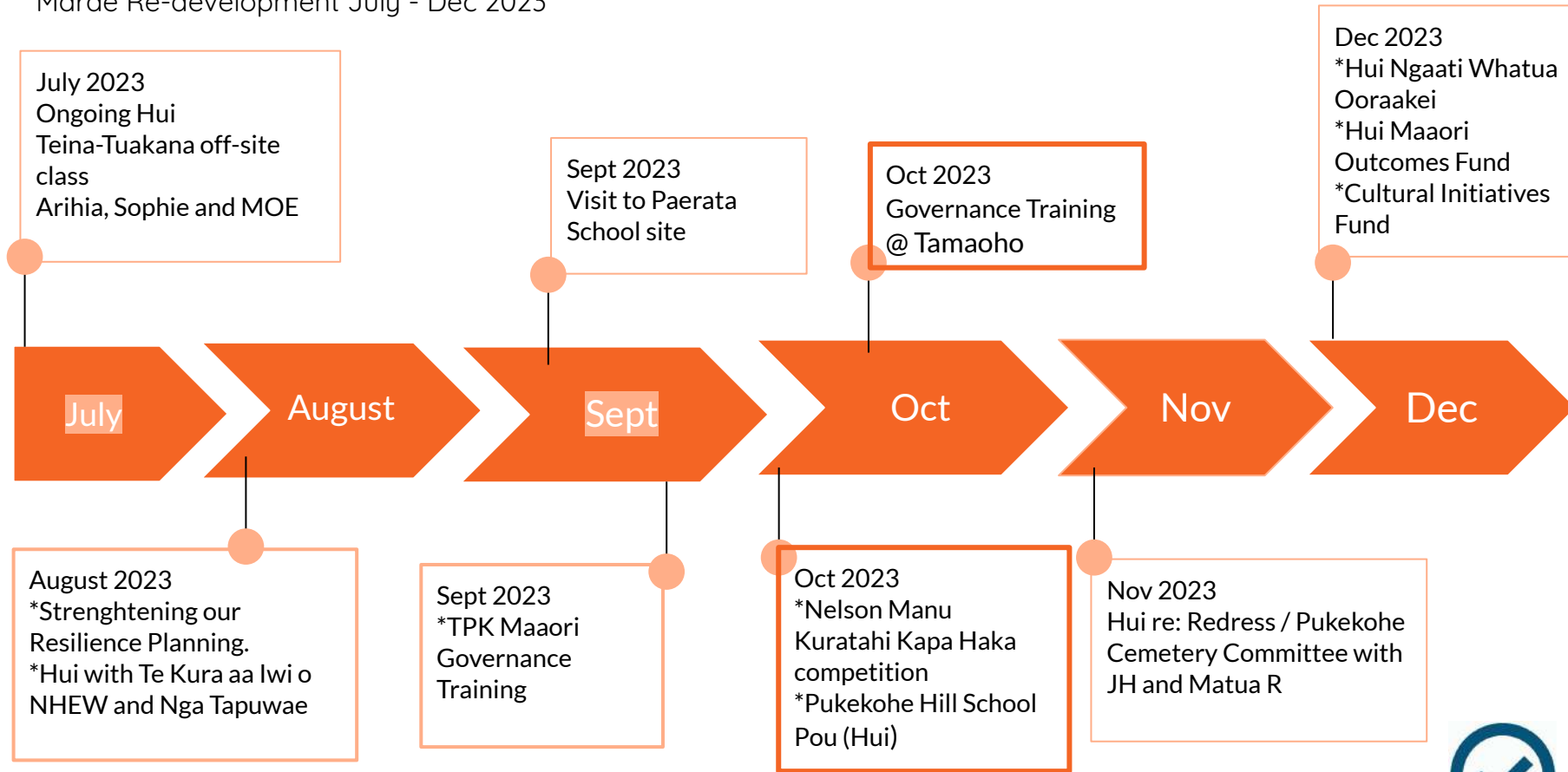
NHEW Papakainga

3. To prepare whaanau with the support and capability to build a foundation to thrive.

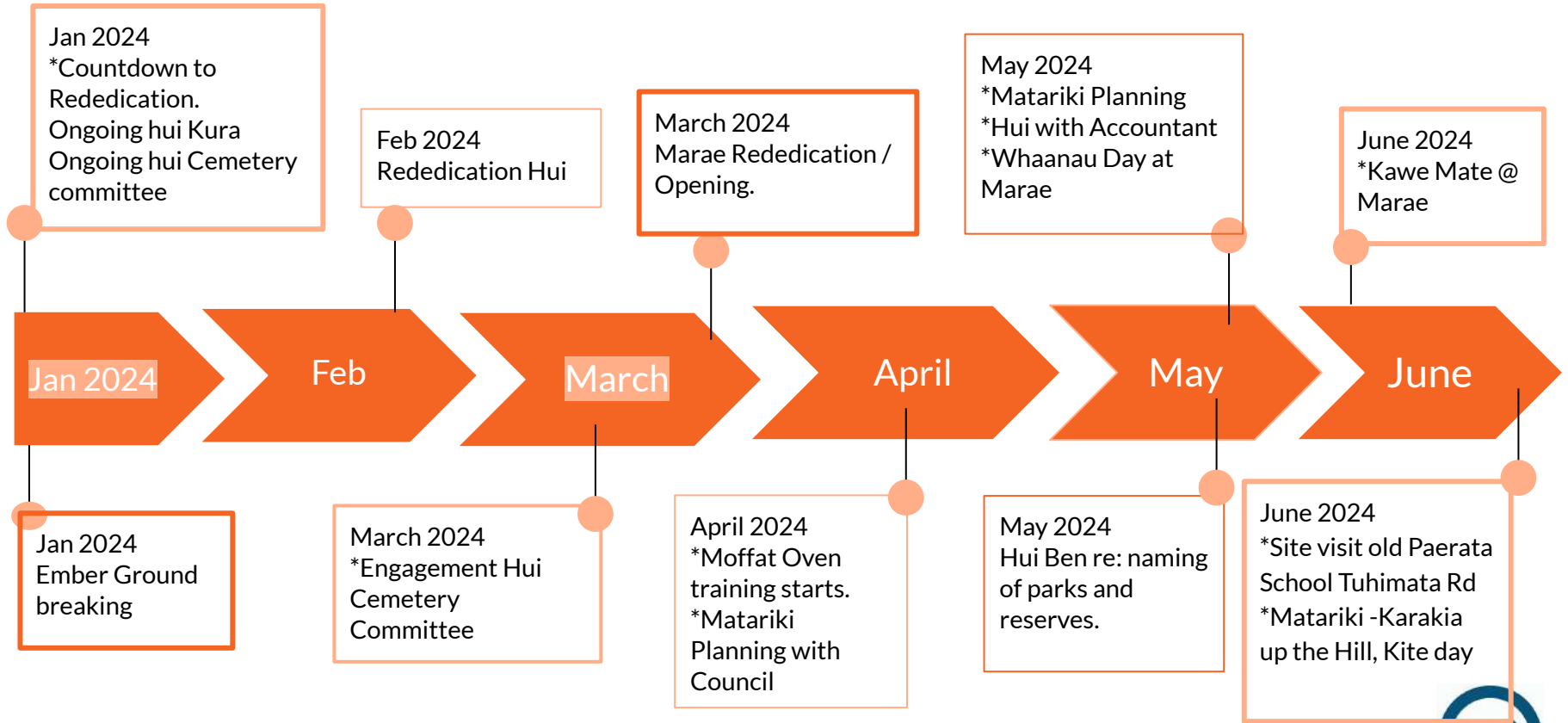
Marae Re-development Jan 2023



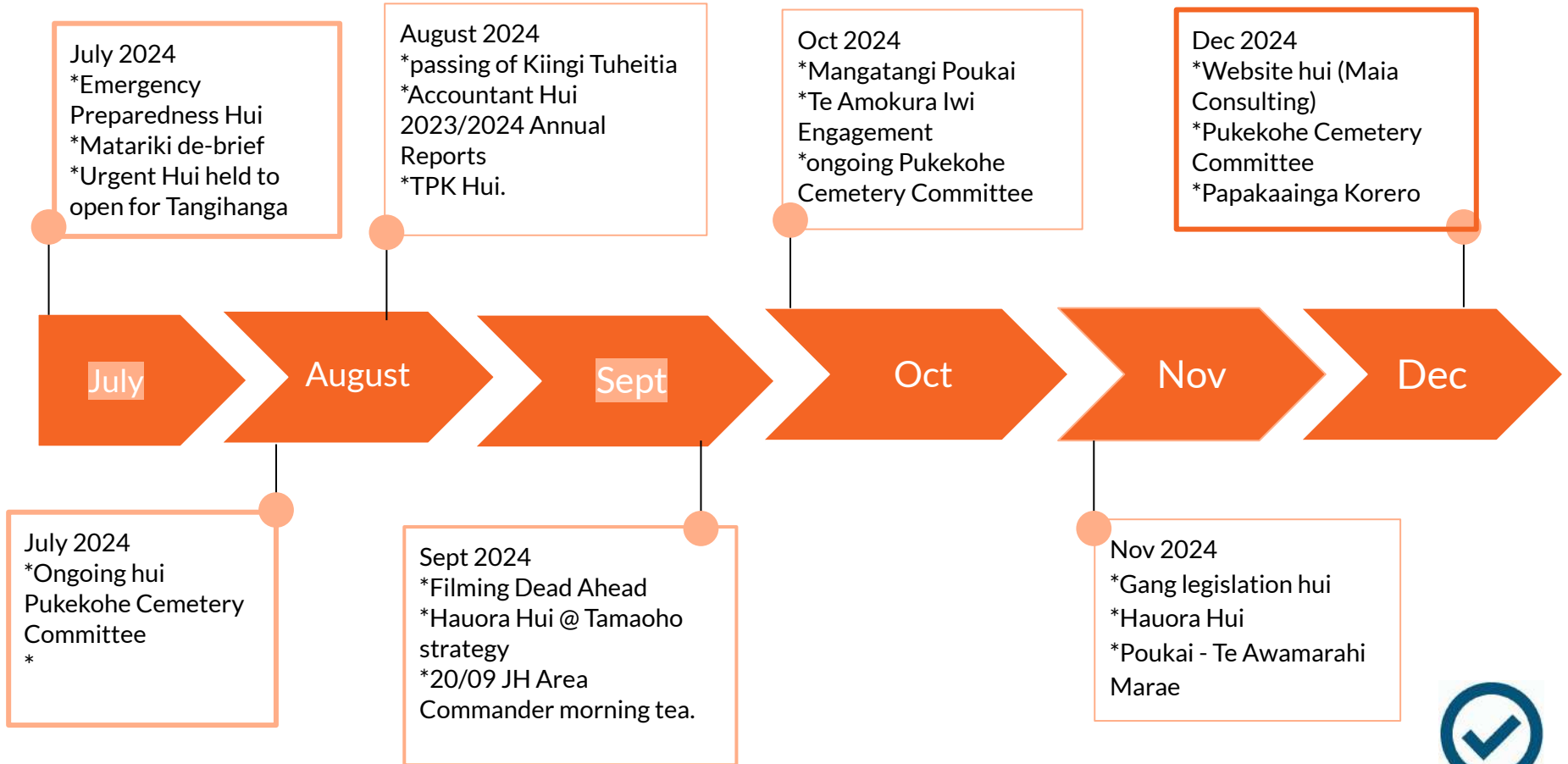
Marae Re-development July - Dec 2023



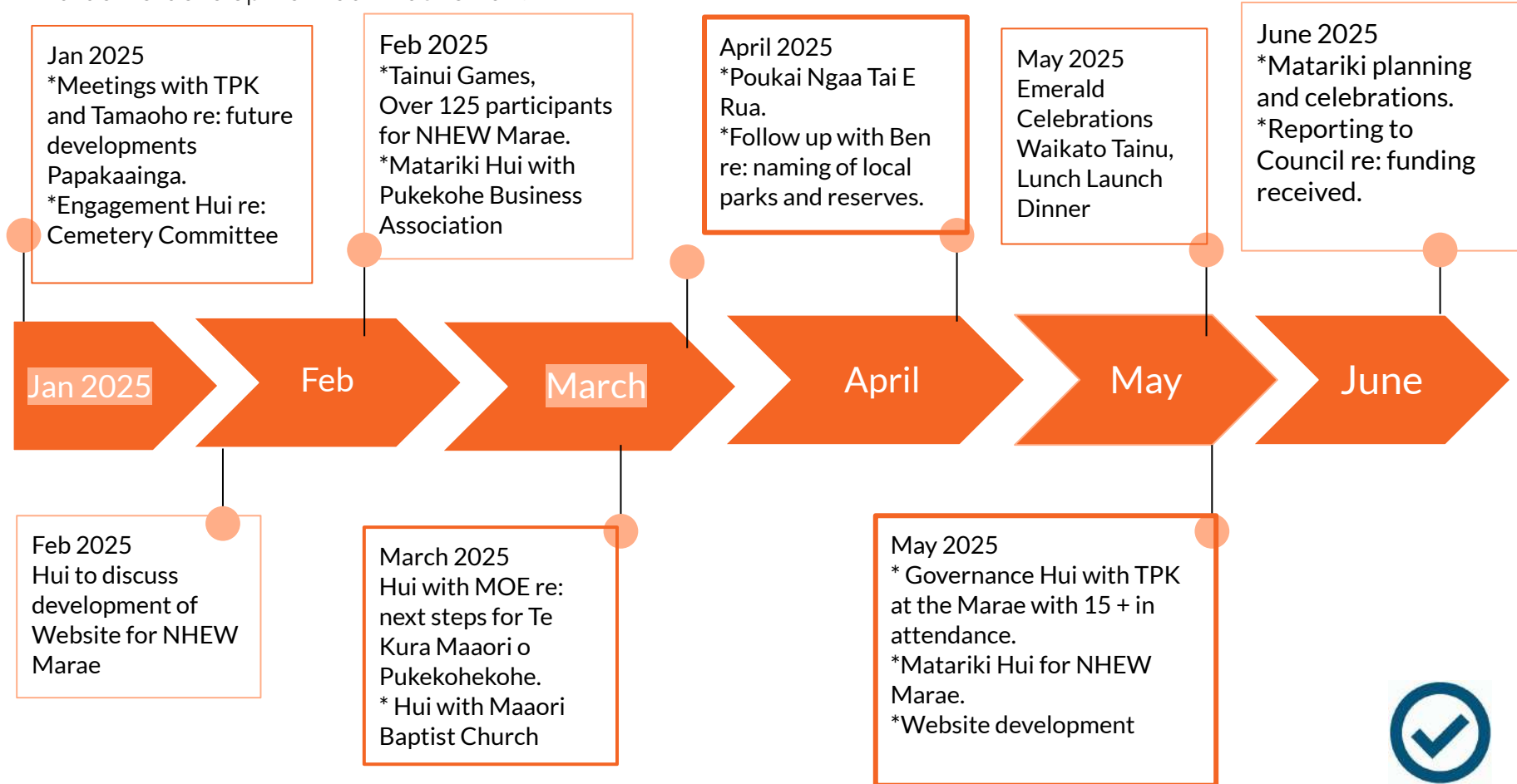
Marae Re-development Jan - June 2024
